

## **Orangecrest PONY Baseball**

### **Q: What is the “Snack Bar Deposit”?**

A: The league requires a \$300 deposit from each team that is refundable when the 2 or more snack bar duties are completed. \$300 divide by 12 players, equals \$25 for each player. A coach may elect to write one check payable to the league and collect directly from the parents or collect individual cash or checks payable to the league. Uniforms cannot be picked up without the snack bar deposit.

### **Q: What is Snack Bar Duty?**

A: In order to help keep registration costs down, each parent is required to volunteer their time at the snack bar. Without the help from volunteers we would not be able to run the league in a proper manner.

A: Each team will be required to provide 2 or more shifts during the season. This will be volunteer time of 2 to 3 hours (for each player) on only one day of the two days assigned. The shifts are 4 to 5 hours on a weekday or Saturday, however will be broken up into several work groups. Coach will assign all shifts and any schedule changes will have to be discussed with the coach. He will basically schedule to have 1 adult representative age 16+ for each player on the team to work a total of 2 hours only. Sometimes there is an additional shift that may require extra volunteers.

### **Q: Is the Snack Bar Deposit refundable to me?**

A: YES. After the season comes to a close, the league will send the coach a check for \$300 after all snack bar duties have been satisfied.

\*\*The coach usually decides to apply these funds towards a team party venue, food, drinks, and player trophies. In the event that a team elects to not have a team party (say for older kids) then the coach can reimburse all the parents their deposit.

### **Q: If I cannot make my scheduled snack bar time, is there another option or buy-out?**

A: You can send a representative in your place (Anyone age 16 or older) to work your shift. Some people who work for school districts send a student volunteer to work the snack bar. This student is able to show that he/she did some community service. The league will provide a buy-out option (separate from your deposit) that a parent can buy out their shift and basically pay someone to work in their place. In order to buy out your snack bar shift, then you must reach out to the Snack Bar Coordinator and request an approved person to work your shift.

### **Q: What happens if I simply DO NOT SHOW up for Snack Bar Duty?**

A: Things happen, but it is best to communicate any issues with your team mom or coach. You cannot simply not show up and forfeit the \$25 deposit because it costs more to buy-out a shift.
